

NZCT CHAMBER MUSIC CONTEST

Rules and Conditions of Entry 2022

Instrumental Performance Section

GENERAL

1. One online entry form per group must be completed by **5pm, Friday 1 April 2022**.
2. **ONE tuned piano (tuned to A440hz) will be provided by CMNZ.** For any performance requiring an additional /different keyboard instrument or piano, or variant tuning it will be the responsibility of the group to source the instrument and pay any hireage/tuning/moving costs **at all levels of the Contest.**
3. With the exception of ONE tuned piano, all instruments (including percussion) must be provided at all levels of the Contest by the group and at their own cost.
4. If the group wishes to employ **prepared piano, or play the instrument in any unconventional manner** (including touching the strings), then this must be stated on your entry form. Any additional hireage fee, tuning or repair of any damage incurred to the piano is at the cost of the group at all levels of the Contest. *Please note that this remains at the discretion of the individual venues/piano owners and may not be permissible in every district. Your District Contest Organiser will confirm whether this option will be possible.*
5. If you wish to make a recording of a performance (audio or visual) you must get permission from the DCO before the contest starts. Recordings must only be for personal use or NCEA. Recordings of District and Regional rounds are not provided by Chamber Music New Zealand.
6. At district and regional levels of the Contest page turners must be full-time school students. At the National Semi Final or Final level of the Contest, page turners may not be a member of another group who are also still in the competition.
7. By entering this Contest, you agree that Chamber Music New Zealand may use your name, photograph or any video for publicity purposes, including video footage and/or sound recordings of any of the performance rounds, which may be made available online as a webcast or for live streaming.

GROUP PERSONNEL AND MAKE-UP

1. All entrants of the Performance Section of the Contest must be full-time school students from Year 7 and upwards, with an upper limit of 19 years of age as at 6 August 2022.
2. Groups of three to eight performers can enter. Any combination of instruments may be used, however the group may include no more than one vocalist and may not include a conductor. There must be one performer to a part, i.e. each performer is to have their own individual line in the piece of music as per the most usual definition of chamber music.
3. Amplification may be used (e.g. electric guitar, bass, organ, synthesizers, looping pedals etc.) at the discretion of the group and must be provided at all levels of the Contest by the group and at their own cost. There will be no extra set up time allocated for any groups which choose to use amplification.
4. Students may compete in no more than two groups nationwide.
5. If a group wishes to include members from more than one district, written approval must be obtained from the National Contest Organiser before entering [contest@chambermusic.co.nz].
6. A District Round group cannot perform, even non-competitively, in a district in which none of the members reside.

REPERTOIRE

1. At District, Regional and National levels, each group is required to present a programme of music consisting of a movement, or movements of a work[s]. Groups may perform multiple works by more than one composer.
2. To be eligible for selection to the National Finals, a group must perform an entire work, or movements from a single work. Single works or movements of works must be heard in their entirety. Repeats are optional.
3. The total performance time for each group must not exceed 15 minutes. Tuning time and pauses between movements will not count as performing time. There is no minimum performance time.
4. At all levels of the Contest, groups must have a copy of the original published score with them or a letter to verify the source is not copyright, i.e. it is in the public domain. Written permission must be obtained from the National Contest Organiser if any alternations are to be made by the musicians to the music in the score. If approved, these changes must be clearly marked in the adjudicator's copy.
5. If the score requires audio-visual, digital or computer equipment, this must be provided and operated by the group. Playing from a digital score is also acceptable. Any additional venue, equipment or other technical costs will be met by the group at all levels of the Contest.
6. Groups selected for the Regional Finals and National Finals must perform the same work, with the same personnel, as at their District Round.

SUCCESSION THROUGH THE CONTEST ROUNDS

1. At the completion of the District Rounds, up to a total of 12 District groups are selected to play at each of the three Regional Finals in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch (a maximum of 36 groups nationwide).
2. The winning group from each District is automatically selected to perform in their Regional Final. The remaining groups will be selected on merit from any of the districts within each region. If a group is selected to perform at the Regional Finals and fails to do so, the group will not be eligible for consideration at the National Finals.
3. Groups selected for the Regional Finals must perform in the Regional Final connected to the District Round they played in.
4. At the completion of the Regional Finals, up to 8 groups will be selected from any of the Regional Finals groups who meet the repertoire Rules & Conditions, to perform at the National Finals. Groups will be selected solely on merit, and there will be no obligation for groups to represent any particular region or district.
5. If selected to play at the Regional Finals and National Finals, the entrants will be responsible for organising and funding their travel and accommodation.

MY VACCINE PASS

1. All live Contest activities will require audience members, parents and teaching/support staff (if on-site) who are over 12 years and 3 months old to have their My Vaccine Pass verified at all District, Regional and National Final venues. As of 12 March 2022, students participating in the Contest will no longer be required to present a My Vaccine Pass in order to participate.

THE DECISIONS OF THE ADJUDICATORS WILL BE FINAL. NO CORRESPONDENCE WILL BE ENTERED INTO.

Any general queries about the Contest or the above rules should be referred to the National Contest Organiser. Decisions made by the National Contest Organiser will be final.
